Mr. Kennedy from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Boonsborough to Hagerstown, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in this state, and for other purposes.

The bill to change the manner of summoning jurors to attend the county courts in Worcester county to repeal certain acts of assembly therein mentioned, and for other purposes, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Whiteley, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the resolution in favour of Joseph Richardson clerk of Caroline county court.—The resolution, was then read a second and third time, by special order assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Whiteley from the committee, to whom was referred the bill to give the levy court of Caroline county, certain discretionary powers therein mentioned, reported the same with the following amendments, viz.—In the 3d line 1st section, after the word “hereafter,” insert the words “shall be.—Which amendment was read and assented to.—The bill was then read a second and third time, by special order, passed with the proposed amendment and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee, made an unfavourable report upon the bill to authorise the clerk of Alleghany county court, to record a deed of conveyance in favour of Christian Harshberger of the state of Pennsylvania.—The bill was then read a second and third time, by special order, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Nelson from the committee, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for regulating the mode of staying execution and for the repealing the acts of assembly therein mentioned, which was read the first time, and ordered to be printed.
