

Determined in the affirmative—So the bill was passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath, from the committee to whom was referred, the bill authorising the governor and council of this state to appoint inspectors of salted fish in the city of Baltimore, reported that a majority of the committee, (from whose opinion he dissented) were of opinion that the said bill ought to pass. The bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, and the question was put 'shall the bill pass?' The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follows.—

Determined in the affirmative, and it was returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Marriott made a favourable report upon the bill for the relief of Martin Fenwick, of Anne Arundel county.—The said bill was read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion, the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for regulating the mode of staying executions, and for repealing the acts of assembly therein mentioned, was re-committed.

The bill for the establishment of a road, and the condemnation of land for its repair in Kent county, was read a second and by special order a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favour of Mrs. Harriet Bennett, widow of Thomas P. Bennett, Esquire, late a member of the house of delegates, which was read the first, and by special order a second and third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Marriott, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill, to provide for the building of a bridge over the Patapsco Falls, at or near the Thistle factory.—The said bill was then read a second time.

The report made on yesterday by Mr. Herbert, from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, was read a second, and by special order a third time, and concurred with.

On motion, by Mr. Herbert, the resolutions mentioned in the said report, were considered, as assented to, and rejected, according to the recommendation of the committee, and they were accordingly so endorsed, and returned to the house of delegates.
