

Mr. Heath from the committee, to whom the said bill was recommitted, reported the same without amendment.—The bill was then read a second time, and amended by inserting after the word "estate," in the 2nd line of the 1st section, the words "hereafter to be created."—The bill was then ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Dennis, reported a bill entitled, an act relative to persons whose title to freedom accrues hereafter, which was read the first time, and the further consideration of the same postponed until to-morrow.

Mr. Heath, reported a bill entitled, an act relating to mortgages in the city and county of Baltimore.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

Wednesday, 7th March, 1827.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the resolution in favour of Thomas Harwood of Prince George's county, and his securities—The resolution was then read a second, and by special order a third time, amended, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the resolution authorising the treasurer of this state to settle the accounts of public officers, upon their paying the principal of their respective debts and interest at the rate of six per cent per annum. The said resolution was then read a second, and by special order a third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

M. Dennis, from the committee, made an unfavourable report upon the bill allowing to Robert Stewart collector of the tax for Somerset county, further time to complete his collections. The said resolution was then read a second, and by special order a third time, dissented from, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath, from the committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise Mary C. Spence of Baltimore county, to sell or lease, and convey the real estate of Robert T. Spence. The said bill was then read the first time.

Mr. Herbert, from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill to provide for completing the records in the office of register of wills for Charles county; and the bill to repeal the eleventh section of an act entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to regulate the inspection of tobacco.—The said bills were then read the second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.
