

‘Provided however, That nothing in this act contained shall be held or construed, to deprive the present commissioners of lotteries, or any commissioner or commissioners, who may have been heretofore appointed of any sum or sums of money, to which before the passage of this act, they may have become entitled to, under the provisions of that part of the first section of the act, supplementary to the act to regulate lotteries, which is by this act repealed.’

And be it enacted, That hereafter, it shall not be lawful to draw any state lottery, till each and every ticket therein have been first sold. And the commissioners are hereby authorised to allow eight per cent discount, to any purchaser of tickets in any one lottery to the amount of twenty thousand dollars or upwards.

The said bill was then read the second and third time by special order, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution for compensating certain services rendered by James L. Hawkins, Nathaniel Williams and James B. Ringgold, as lottery commissioners, which was read the first, second and third time by special order, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates:
