

In the 3d line of the first section, strike out the word 'nine' and insert in lieu thereof 'ten.'

Strike out 'nine' in the 4th line of same section, and insert 'ten.'

After the word 'county' at the end of the sixth line, insert 'shall compose the third district.'

Strike out the word 'third' in the seventh line, and insert 'fourth.'

Strike out 'fourth' in the ninth line, and insert 'fifth;' strike out 'fifth' in the same line, and insert 'sixth;' strike out 'sixth' in the tenth line, and insert 'seventh;' strike out 'seventh' in the eleventh line, and insert 'eighth;' strike out 'eighth' in the twelfth line, and insert 'ninth;' strike out 'ninth' in the fourteenth line, and insert 'tenth;' strike out the sixteenth line, and insert in lieu of it the following:

'The fifth district which shall be entitled to two electors.'

Strike out the words 'the respective districts' in the seventeenth line, and insert in lieu, the words 'that district.'

After much discussion the question was put, 'will the senate assent to the same.'—The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:

AFFIRMATIVE.

Determined in the negative.

The following amendment was offered and assented to:

Strike out the words 'respecting elections' in the title, to reduce into one the several acts of assembly, respecting elections, and to regulate said elections.'

The question was then put, 'shall this bill pass.'—The yeas and nays being required appeared as follows:
