

Your committee would also refer to a report made at December session, eighteen hundred and sixteen, votes and proceeding of the Senate, page thirty, by Mr. Winder from the committee to consider and report on the resolution of the house of delegates granting five thousand dollars a year for six years to the hospital, and it appears by that report the funds which had been applied by the state to the hospital, were as follows:

The appropriation of 1797	\$8,000
That of 1811 \$5000 for 3 years	15,000
The proposed appropriation and which was granted	30,000
To which should be added the proceeds of the Lottery	\$30,000
Making a total granted by the state of	\$78,000
In the same report it is stated that the committee were informed that the City of Baltimore had contributed the sum of	18,000
That Messrs McKenzie and Smyth drew a prize of	15,000
in their own right, which was applied to the hospital, and that they had also expended out of their own funds	\$8,500
Making a total sum of	\$41,000
Making a total sum of	\$114,500

The report of the aforesaid committee concludes with the following words—"That if the City of Baltimore and the present lessees recinded the lease and acceded to the terms and provisions of the law, that the appropriations made by the resolutions referred to the committee, should be paid to said board to be applied under their direction, in such manner as shall best promote the great object of the institution.

By resolution number forty five, session eighteen hundred and sixteen, Doctors Colin M'Kenzie and James Smyth, were authorized to borrow five thousand dollars annually for the term of six years; and the state has paid the same—amounting in all to the sum of thirty thousand dollars.

In the report of the joint committee appointed at the last session of the legislature to visit the hospital, see the journal of the house of delegates, page four hundred and twenty six, it is stated that Doctor M'Kenzie, now deceased, expressed his satisfaction that the legislature had at last thought proper to examine the establishment, and his readiness to receive the committee, and offered them every facility in his power.
