

of the Patapsee river, from a point on the lands of Richard Cromwell, to a point on the opposite shore, on the land of William Krebs, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Herbert and Harrison.

The bill to alter the present mode of appointing the justices of the levy court of Anne Arundel county, so that each election district and the city of Annapolis may have one member, was read a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to alter and amend the constitution and form of government, and to repeal the 60th section article thereof, was read a second time by special order.

On motion by Mr. Sewell, the president named Mr. Kennedy to supply the vacancy in the committee on divorces occasioned by the absence of Mr. Spence.

Mr. Heath from the committee, made an unfavorable report upon the bill to remunerate Robert Boone of Anne Arundel county, for the loss of a certain negro slave therein mentioned. The said bill was then read a third time, and after some discussion, the question was put, shall the bill pass—determined in the negative. So the bill was rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the council delivered a communication from the executive, enclosing the "account of Washington G. Tuck, for covering the state-house, together with a report from Mr. Tuck in explanation thereof," which was read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

On motion by Mr. Herbert, the president named Mr. Lloyd to supply the vacancy occasioned by the absence of Mr. Thomas in the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

The senate proceeded to the consideration of the unfinished business of yesterday, being the bill to incorporate the Lanvale Manufacturing Company, with the amendment proposed to the same by Mr. Heath on yesterday, to wit: to strike out the words, "and of the individuals composing the same;" so as to exempt the persons composing the corporation from liability in their individual capacity for the payment of the debts of the corporation, the question before the senate being on the adoption of the amendment, and after considerable discussion the question was postponed until to-morrow.
