

Mr. Heath from the committee, made a favorable report upon the supplement to the act for the opening of Ensor street in the city of Baltimore. The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Heath from the committee to whom was referred the bill for the relief of Francis Mathews of Cecil county, reported the same with the following amendment, viz; strike out the name of "Frances," wherein it occurs in the bill, and insert the name of "Francina." which amendment, was read and assented to. The said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Heath from the committee made a favourable report upon the supplement to the act for the opening of Monument street in the City of Baltimore. The said bill was then read a second time.

The Senate adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

Monday, 28th January, 1828.

The Senate met. Present the same members as on Saturday, except Messrs. Marriott, Pres. Harrison, Heath Kennedy, Nelson.

The senate proceeded to the election of a President pro, tem. The ballot box being prepared, the ballots were deposited therein, and on counting the same by the Clerk, it appeared that John C. Herbert Esquire, had seven votes, and James Thomas Esquire, had one vote, whereupon it was declared in the senate that John C. Herbert Esquire having had a majority of votes, was duly elected President of the senate, pro. tem. and he accordingly took the chair.

The proceeding of Saturday were read.

The bill for the division of Queen-Anns county, into election districts, was read a second time.

On motion the bill relating to the swearing of petit jurors, was referred to Messrs. Forrest, Lloyd and Dennis.

The bill to ascertain and settle the salaries of the Members of the Executive Council for the present year, was read a second, and by special order a third time, and returned to the house of delegates.

A bill to authorise Amos Ewing, to convey a piece of land therein mentioned, to Henry Broughten, was read a second time, and referred to the committee on invalid deeds.
