

plement to an act entitled, an act for the establishment and support of public free schools in the first election district of Baltimore county, was referred to Messrs. Heath, Rees and Forrest

Mr. Kennedy from the committee to whom was recommitted the act respecting naturalization, reported the same with the following amendments, viz: 1st. In the 2d section, 5th line after the word "made," insert the word "as"—2d. Strike out after the word "effectual," in the 2d section, 5th line, and insert the words "to every intent and purpose whatsoever, and that the title or interest in the real property intended to be conveyed or transferred, shall be as good;" which amendments were read and assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Herbert from the committee, made a favorable report upon the further supplement to the act for the recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and nine, chapter seventy-six; the said bill was then read a second time.

On motion, the supplement to the act for the more effectual protection of public worship in this state, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-four, chapter fifty-three, was referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Rees and Whiteley.

The bill to repeal an act to declare certain trespasses felony, and for other purposes, passed at December session, 1826, chapter 260, so far as relates to Calvert and Baltimore counties, was read a second time by special order.

The bill for the relief of Francis Mathews of Cecil county, was read a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act for founding an university in the city or precincts of Baltimore by the name of the university of Maryland, was read a second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Heath from the committee made a favorable report upon the bill to authorize the building of a bridge across the south branch of the Patapsco river from a point on the lands of Richard Cromwell, to a point on the opposite shore, on the land of William Krebs; the said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Dennis from the committee made a favorable report upon the bill to revive an act passed at November session 1811 chapter 153, and to repeal an act passed at December session 1826 chapter 144, concerning the town of Salsbury in Somers-
