

On motion of Mr. Kennedy, the senate re-considered the resolution respecting the claims of the surviving officers and soldiers of the revolution.

Mr. Kennedy moved further to amend the same, by adding the following to wit, Resolved that the Governor be requested to forward a copy of the above resolution to each of our senators and representatives in congress, which amendment was read and assented to, and the resolution so amended, was returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following message, which was read.

By the House of Delegates, January 30th, 1828.
Gentlemen of the Senate,

This house having authorised the committee of ways and means, on the 22d inst. to make certain calls upon the several Banks in this State, in which the State holds stock for specific information, and having further required on the 25th inst. a return from said banks upon other matters touching as we consider the interests of the community and essential to the security of the resources of this State, over which it becomes our bounden duty to superintend. Believing as we do, that ample time should be allowed to those institutions to comply with the above calls, and that no injury can result from a short delay in the appointment of Bank Directors on the part of the State. We propose with your concurrence to postpone the election of Directors until Wednesday next the 6th day of February.
