

Mr. Forrest presented a petition from Henry L. Davis, which was read the first time and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Jesse Robinson of Queen Ann's county, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Harrison, Rees and Whiteley.

Also a bill entitled, an act, for re-establishing a road and landing at a place commonly called the ship yard in Kent county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Rees, Dennis and Sewell.

Mr. Harrison presented the petition of Henry Hindman of Queen-Anns county, which was read and referred to Messrs. Harrison, Heath and Nelson.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, ten o'clock.

Friday, February 1st, 1828.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday.

The proceeding of yesterday were read.

Mr. Heath from the committee made a favorable report upon the bill relating to the county tax in the city of Baltimore; the said bill was then read a second and by special order a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill further to regulate proceedings in the court of Chancery, and of the several county courts as courts of Equity in this state, was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Harrison, the further supplement to an act, entitled, an act for the recovery of small debts out of court and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned, passed at November session 1809, chapter 76, was ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Dennis, the bill authorising Thomas J. Mann to convey certain lands to David Webb and Mary his wife this day entitled to a third reading, was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following message, which was read;
