

Mr. Heath from the committee to whom was referred the petition of A. McDonald and others, reported a bill entitled, an act for the opening and extension of Lombard street in the city of Baltimore, which was read the first time.

Mr. Forrest presented the petition of Arnold T. Minson, praying for relief therein mentioned, which was referred to Messrs. Forrest, Dennis and Rees.

Mr. Kennedy asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, an act to vest in the Orphans' Courts, the powers exercised by the County or Criminal Courts by the "act entitled, an act for the better regulation of Apprentices." The leave was referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Lloyd and Dennis.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant children of Benjamin B. Wroth, late of Kent County, deceased, passed December session, 1825, chapter 217, was read the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Dennis from the committee to whom was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise Amos Ewing to convey a piece of land therein mentioned, to Henry B. Broughton, reported unfavorable thereon; the said bill was then read the third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Heath from the committee to whom was referred the petition of Wm. Hays of Baltimore, praying the passage of a law to empower him to convey a lot of ground in the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had had the same under consideration, and had directed him to report unfavorably thereon.

Mr. Forrest from the committee, to whom the bill entitled, an act relating to the swearing of petit jurors, reported unfavorably thereon. The bill was then read the third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following message, to wit:

A preamble and resolution in favor of Thomas Baldwin and Samuel Scott, Jr. of Prince George's County, which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Also, a bill entitled, an act to repeal the act, entitled, an act supplementary to an act, passed at November session,
