

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Bayley L. Clark of Prince George's County, was read the third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the recovery of small debts out of Court, and to repeal the acts of Assembly therein mentioned, passed at November session, 1809, chapter 76, was read the third time, and on the question being put, "shall the bill pass." The yeas and nays were asked for, and when taken, appeared as follows:

The bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act relating to the road lately located from Sharpsburg to Hagerstown in Washington County, was read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following message, to wit:

Also, the bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, "an act concerning crimes and punishments, passed at November session, 1809, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Herbert, Lloyd and Thomas.

Also, the bill entitled, an act for the erection of a new gaol in Hagerstown, in Washington County, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Sewell, and Whiteley.

Mr. Johnson asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the benefit of Alfred H. Dasheill and others of the city of Baltimore. The leave was referred to Messrs. Johnson, Heath and Rees.
