So the bill was passed, and it was returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution relative to the states claim upon the United States for interest on mon es expended during the late war, which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

And returned the bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, for the recovery of small debts out of Courts, and to repeal the acts of Assembly therein mentioned, passed at November session, 1809, chapter seventy-nine, yesterday rejected by the senate.
