

the recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned passed at November session 1809, chapter 76, and upon such re-consideration have again rejected the same, and returned it to your honorable body.

The same having been read, the question was put "will the senate receive the substitute. Determined in the affirmative.

The question was then put will the senate assent to the message, determined in the affirmative, and it was sent to the house of delegates with the bill to which it relates.

The clerk of the Council delivered a communication from his Excellency the Governor, enclosing a report and resolution of the Legislature of Georgia, on the subjects of the Tariff and Internal Improvements, which were read and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The resolution relative to hoisting the States' flag on the dome of the State House, was read a second and by special order a third time, dissented from, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Forrest presented the petition of sundry inhabitants of Frederick and Montgomery county, praying the passage of a law for the further security of persons holding slaves in said counties, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Harrison and Nelson.

The bill for the relief of Elizabeth Hardiken of Dorchester county, was read a third time, and the question was put "shall the bill pass." The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follows.
