

The bill for the relief of Washington Lucas of Washington county, was read a third time passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Nelson, the bill for the relief of Chas. H. W. Wharton of the city of Washington, in the District of Columbia, and Rebecca Wharton his wife, this day entitled to a third reading, was ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Johnson, the supplement to the act to provide for electing commissioners for Baltimore county, and prescribing their powers and duties, passed at December session 1826, chapter 217, this day entitled to a second reading, was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Aquila Beall, clerk of Prince Georges county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Herbert, Lloyd and Harrison.

Mr. Nelson from the committee, on internal improvement, to whom was referred the petition of the president and managers of the Washington and Baltimore turnpike road reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise the president, managers and company of the Washington and Baltimore turnpike road, to construct a rail road from the city of Baltimore to the District of Columbia, in the direction of the city of Washington, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed.

The senate proceeded to the consideration of the supplement to the act to provide for electing commissioners for Baltimore county, and prescribing their powers and duties, passed at December session 1826, chapter 17; on proceeding to the second reading of the same, Mr. Johnson moved to amend the bill by inserting after the word "county" in the 4th line of the 2nd section, the words "and city jointly as," which amendment was read and assented to.

On the further reading of the bill, Mr. Johnson moved to strike out the word, 'records,' in the 4th line of the 9th section, and insert the word 'extracts;' which amendment was read and assented to.

Mr. Johnson moved to strike out the word 'chargeable,' in the 9th line of the 9th section, and insert the word 'paid,' which amendment was read and assented to,

Mr. Heath moved to strike out the word 'improper,' in the 3d line of the 11th section, which amendment was assented to.
