

NEGATIVE.

Determined in the negative.

The bill for the relief of James Galbraith of Cecil county, upon which an unfavourable report was made by the committee on divorces, on the 13th inst. was read a third time, and the question was put, 'shall the bill pass,' determined in the negative, so the bill was rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to divorce Augustus J. T. Geraud, and Mary Ann his wife, of the city of Baltimore, was read a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for electing commissioners for Baltimore county, and prescribing their powers and duties, passed at December session 1826, chapter 217, was read a third time, by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The senate resumed the third reading of the supplement to an act, to incorporate a company, to make a turnpike road to lead from the cross roads, near Richard Caton's lime kiln, in Baltimore county, nearly in the direction of Jones' Falls, to the city of Baltimore.

The bill being on its third reading and not being amendable, unless by the unanimous consent of the senate, according to the 26th rule of the senate. Mr. Johnson moved to dispense with that part of the 26th rule of the senate, which prohibited the amendment of the bill, without such consent, which is in these words to wit, 'no amendment shall be received at the third reading of any bill, resolution, order, report or other proposition originating in the senate, unless by unanimous consent of the members present,' and the question was put, and determined in the affirmative.

The clerk then proceeding to the third reading of the bill, Mr. Heath moved to amend the same by striking out the word 'majority,' in the 9th line of the 2d section, and inserting the words 'major part,' so that the bill might read 'provided however, that the proprietors of a major part of the capital stocks, which amendment was read, and assented to.

Mr. Lloyd moved to strike out the following words of the 2d section commencing after the words 'And be it enacted, that the president, managers and company of the said Falls turnpike road' shall have enjoy and exercise all the powers, rights and privileges, for the location, construction, preservation, use and benefit of the said road, and
