

1st. In the 6th line of the 1st section after the word 'liquor,' insert the word 'imported.'

2nd. In the 11th line of the same section, strike out the words 'to vend any of the specified articles,' and insert in lieu thereof, the words 'under the present existing laws.'

3d. In the 13th line of the same section, after the word 'passed,' insert the following proviso. 'And provided also, that no license shall be granted under the laws existing, by any clerk of any county court of this state, or by the clerk of the city court of Baltimore (after the passage of this act) which shall extend beyond the first day of May next.

4th. In the 4th line after the word 'manner,' in the 3rd section, strike out all that follows of that section, and insert the words 'now provided by law,' proviso, Provided nevertheless, that if the grand jury of any county court, or of the city court of Baltimore shall signify to the county court or city court of Baltimore, (as the case may be) their opinion that a license ought not to be granted to any individual or individuals, named in the lists to be laid before them, under the provisions of this act, that the clerks of said courts shall not be authorised to grant a license or licenses, to any such individual or individuals, without the special direction of the court.

5th. In the 24th line of the 5th section, after the word 'them,' strike out all that follows of that section.

6th. In the 7th line of the 7th section, after the word 'Maryland,' strike out all that follows of the section, and insert in lieu thereof, the following, 'to be recovered by action of debt or indictment in the county court of the county where such offence shall have been committed, or in Baltimore city court, if the offence shall have been committed within the limits of said city.'

Mr. Forrest moved to lay the bill and message upon the table, and the question was put and determined in the negative.

Mr. Dennis then moved to make the said bill the order of the day for Monday next, and it was accordingly so ordered.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a bill to authorise William Moore to sell and convey the lands therein mentioned, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Heath and Whiteley.
