

Also, a bill to lay out and open certain streets, lanes and alleys in Westminster, Frederick county, which was read the first, and by special order a second time.

Mr. Forrest moved to amend the same by adding the following proviso at the end of the bill. 'Provided that no street lane or alley to be opened under the authority of this act shall pass through any Tan Yard in or near said Town.' which amendment was read, and assented to.

The bill was then read a third time by special order, and passed with the proposed amendment.

Also, a bill entitled, an act for the re-valuation of the real and personal property in Kent county, which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Rees, Harrison and Lloyd.

Also, a bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act relating to the city of Baltimore, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Heath, Johnson and Sewell.

Also, a bill to settle and determine the compensation of judges and clerks of elections in Baltimore county, which was read the first time.

Also, a supplement to the act granting leave to the trustees of the town of West Nottingham congregation in Cecil county, and their successors to receive a deed or deeds for and hold the lands therein mentioned, passed at November session 1818, chapter 35, which was read the first time.

Also, a bill to continue in force an act passed at December session 1823, chapter 185, entitled, 'an act, to repair the highways and bridges, in certain parts of the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes, which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Johnson, Kennedy and Rees.

Also, a bill to change the place of holding elections for vestry men and church wardens, and the regular meetings of the vestry of Somerset parish in Somerset county which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Dennis, Lloyd and Huteley.

Mr. Kennedy asked and obtained leave of absence for Mr. Nelson.

The senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.
