MARYLAND:-To wir:

At a Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held at the City of Annapolis, on the last Monday in December, being the 30th day of the month, in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, the following Senators appeared in the Senato Chamber, to wit: John G. Chapman, Dennis Claude, Thomas Emory, Benjamin S. Forrest, John C. Groome, William Hughlett, Charles F. Mayer, James Montgomery, John B. Morris, Samuel G. Osborn, Henry Page, Thomas Sappington, and William T. Wootton, Esquires.

On motion of Mr. Claude, the senate proceeded to organise by the election of a President.

On motion of Mr. Hughlett, Mr. Forrest was put in nomination.

The ballot box was prepared and the ballots deposited therein, and on examination thereof by the clerk, it appeared there had been twelve votes given, all of which were for Mr. Forrest.

Whereupon it was declared that the honorable Benjamin S. Forrest is unanimously elected president of the Senate.
