Was read the third time by special order, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill entitled, an act to establish inferior courts in the several counties of this state, and to prescribe their jurisdiction.

Was read the third time by special order, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Emory from the committee on pensions, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of sundry poor persons therein mentioned, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the econd, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Mayer submitted the following resolution,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

By the Senate,

March 15, 1834.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Maryland Hospital and all the grounds thereto belonging, be and the same are hereby directed to be surrendered to and vested in the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, as its property and estate for the purpose of a lunatic hospital or asylum, provided the buildings of said hospital (save and except the western wing thereof) be by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, at its expense, put in thorough repair, and sufficiently furnished within eighteen months from the time of the passage of this resolution.

And be it further resolved, that so soon within the period aforesaid as the Governor and Council shall be satisfied of said repairs, and furnishing having been made, they shall in such form and minner as they may deem proper, cause the said property to be conveyed to, and vested as aforesaid, in the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to be used and occupied as a lunatic hospital or lunatic asylum,
