Groome, Morris and Mayer, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for electing commissioners for Cecil county by districts, and prescribing their duties and powers, and repealing an act and its supplements therein mentioned.

On motion of Mr. Wootton,

The question was put,

“Shall the bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Merchants' Bank of Baltimore be read the third time by special order?”

And it was determined in the negative.

Mr. Groome, from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for electing commissioners for Cecil county, by districts, and prescribing their duties and powers, and repealing an act and its supplements therein mentioned;

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Groome,

Read the third time by special order, and passed.
