

Mr. Groome from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorize John Archer of Cecil county, and Anne Archer of Harford county, to construct certain wharves, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

Add at end of bill the words,
