

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the bill was then ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Emory, from the committee on internal improvement, to which was referred the bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act incorporating a company to make a turnpike road from Williamsport to Hagerstown, passed at December session 1832, chapter 125, reported favourably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

By the House of Delegates,

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message of the first instant, asking of this house to return to your body two bills, entitled, a supplement, and an additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act to encourage internal improvement, for the purpose of reconsideration, and amendment, in compliance therewith we return to your honourable body the said bills.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the Senate resumed the consideration of the unfinished business of yesterday, being the bill, entitled, an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this state, and to prescribe their jurisdiction.

The bill was being further read the third time, when on motion of Mr. Groome, the following amendments were read and assented to—

Strike out in the 17th line of the 3d section, the words "taking an appeal bond," and insert in lieu thereof the words, "in all cases of appeal"—and in same line the words "the same," and insert "all the papers and proceedings relating to the case."

10th line, — section, after the word "resides," insert "provided he resides in the state of Maryland."

At the end of the 6th section, add "in money."

On motion of Mr. Hughlett, the following amendments were read and adopted:

In the 24th line of the 8th section, strike out the words "fifty," and insert "one hundred."

In the 25th line of the same section, strike out the words "ten days," and insert "not more than six months."
