Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the contract for printing, made, or to be made for the printing of the next session of the Legislature, and all future contracts for printing, shall be so made and modified, as to provide that the Acts of Assembly shall be printed as they shall severally pass, so as nearly as possible, to have the printing of all the acts of every session hereafter of the General Assembly completed by, or immediately upon the close of such session.

And be it resolved, That the chief clerk of the Senate, and the chief clerk of the House of Delegates, shall respectively cause to be furnished to the Printer contracting for the printing of the Laws, copies examined by said chief clerks, of the Acts of Assembly as the same shall severally be passed by either branch hereafter ordering the employment of such clerks, as may be necessary, in order to the promptly furnishing of such copies.
