By the House of Delegates,

March 31st, 1836.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We herewith return to your honorable body the resolution respecting the Baltimore and Port Deposit Rail Road, and inasmuch as this house after a long and careful examination into all the facts of the case have deemed it expedient to direct the institution of legal proceedings against the said Baltimore and Port Deposit Rail Road Company as recommended by the said resolution for the protection of the rights and interests of the citizens of Baltimore and Harford counties as well as that of all the other citizens of this state so far as regards the free navigation of navigable waters of said counties. We therefore respectfully ask that you will reconsider and pass said resolution.
