Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message requesting us to reconsider and recede from the amendments proposed to the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Union Company; and, in spirit of courtesy, have reconsidered the same, in which, however, we have not found cause of recession from our proposition; on the contrary, we regard the original act as among the most liberal of the numerous grants of the public prerogative at the present session of the Legislature. And that, that liberality is further extended by the amendments in question, inasmuch as the pittance reserved for the aid of education, is postponed until the profits of the corporation shall have amounted to four and twenty fold of that reservation,
