

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following resolutions:

A resolution in favor of John D. Toy, and

A resolution in favor of Claude and Hammond,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

Also, the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act relating to equity proceedings, and

A bill entitled, an act relating to bills of sales,

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the proprietors of the present bridge at Harper's Ferry,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Sappington and Emory.

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of the Baltimore and Ohio rail road company,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Morris, Mayer and Claude.

And returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, a further supplement to an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances and securing the estates of purchasers, endorsed, 'will pass.'

Also, returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act to regulate the inspection of tobacco, endorsed, 'will not pass.'

Mr. Sappington, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise and require the levy court of Frederick county, to distribute the interest accumulating on the school fund of said county, for the purposes therein mentioned, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Emory, from the committee to which was referred the resolutions relative to the revenue arising from the sale of the public lands of the United States, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates,

Mr. Hughlett from the committee on revolutionary claims.
