Mr. Morris from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution in favor of Claude and Hammond, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution in favor of the assistant committee clerks,

Which was read the first and by special order the second and third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Also, delivered the following bills:

A bill entitled, an act for the suppression of frauds in the management of the affairs of corporations in this State,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the clerk of Baltimore county court to record a deed therein mentioned,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings.

And returned the following bills, which originated in the senate, severally endorsed, 'will pass.'

A bill entitled, an act to authorize John Mactavish to act as trustee in the case therein mentioned, and to hold lands as tenant by the courtesy.

A bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to free negroes and slaves, passed at December session 1831, chapter 323.

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of John Reynolds and others, of Washington county.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise the recording of a deed of manumission from Francis Hollingsworth of Frederick county.

Also, returned the following bills which originated in the senate, severally endorsed, 'will not pass.'

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act entiled, an act relating to persons of color, who are to be free after the expiration of a term of years.
