

It shall be lawful for the Governor for this year  
only to make a Provisional Piscalloway and to af-  
fect the charge of it upon every head able to bear  
arms inhabiting within the Province at any time  
before the first of December next so that such charge  
upon any head exceed not a Bundle of Corn or fifty  
pounds of Tobacco with tank at the Choice of the  
Party and to press any Soldiers to their Service  
at the rate of three and twenty Bundles of Corn or  
One thousand weight of Tobacco with Cash and three  
Bundles of Corn for years pay and to appoint the  
Payment of such Soldier in such hundred and such  
Place of the hundred as the Governor shall see fittest  
and to appoint one or two Slaves in every hundred  
to which all Persons chargeable within the hundred  
shall bring the Corn or Tobacco charged upon them  
before the first day of December next and if any  
one chargeable as aforesaid shall not pay the same  
according to such Order as shall be appointed by the  
Governor as aforesaid such Party so in default shall  
be forfeit to the Party to whose Payment he was char-  
ged double the quantity of value of the Tobacco or  
Corn so charged to be levied upon the Party Offen-  
ding by way of distress and the charge of the late  
Expedition to Kent of this Assembly as shall  
be allowed by the Court is to be defrayed out of  
this Levy
