The Sense of the Governor and Council touching
the difficulty and Evynt made by the Lower House
in the words of the writ for Election of Burgesses is
this

That the writ was directed to the Sheriff to make proclamation for the Election of Burgesses is that when the Freeman had most ill used in their power to elect Burgesses any person qualified for the Employment that was not disabled by fynd them already committed that the number of persons to be Electors was in the yeare past writ to the Sheriff, but only soe as he did wyprevent the body Aggregation of the County and the only person to whom the Law directed the Sheriff for Summoning Assemblye and that upon the whole matter it was in the Sheriffes power to destroye only persons disabled by law to elect or be electors and the diminution of the numbers and of the persons to be Electors in the Freeman of the County and this was thought fit to rectifie.
