2. That no one speake above one, at one reading, to any Bill  
without licence of the speaker: And if Two persons or more rise  
together, The speaker shall appoint who may speake first,  
and one may interrupt another, or speake till the other have  
said.

3. No one shall deliver his opinion, or speake p<sup>er</sup>ting to any Bill  
But shall stand up reverently, directing his speech to the speaker

4. Every Bill proposed to the house, shall be read three severall  
times before it be engrossed: & between every reading, one day  
shall be intermitted: unless upon urgent occasion, the speaker  
shall dispense therewith, And then one Bill being read two times  
at one sitting, shall be sufficient as read two severall times in  
times, when soe entered on the Clerk's Journall.
