Lords and Prop^{rt} thereof - pursuant to the votes of this house, Entered
in the Journal of this house, last Meeting.

And Ordered that the vote be sent to the Committee for inspecting
the Journal of this house of the last Meeting, that they may draw
up the bill accordingly.

The aforesaid Order signed by the Clerk of this house is sent to the said
Committee by Mr. Richard Hall.

He returnes and says he hath delivered the same
Col^l. Henry Darnall and Mr. Feery Jewell come with a Message
from the upper house, which being read is as follows viz:-

Upper house April 5th 1684.

His Majst having signified to this house the great care and trouble
he hath taken in having fairly transcribed the temporall and perpetuall
Laws of this Province for his personal and Examination of that Assembly
hath likewise desired for his further satisfaction and to prevent the
unnecessary delay of messages, that the Lower house would resolve them
selves into a grand Committee, and joyn with this house in inspecting
and Examining the said Laws, or to appoint some of their Members
to joyn with some of the Members of this house therein, to the end that
they may receive of His nob^{lt} and confirmation of this Assembly.

With his Majst most gracious assent thereunto,

In obedience whereunto this house doth profess Monday next to be
appointed to doe the same.
