Mr. Jenkins, Mr. Scarborough, and all Dorset County Burgesses enter the House.

Resolved Mr. Speaker y^eue Want to y^e Hon^{ble} His Ma^{ty} Secretary of the Province to present Writts for y^e Election of two Burgesses in St. Marys County, one in Calvert County, one in Baltimore, one in Talbot, one in Cecil, and one in Prince Georges County in the place of Mr. Robert Mafor, Capt. John Bayne, Mr. George Singham, Major James Maxwell, Mr. Nicholas Low and Col. William Pierce now Sheriffs of y^e S. County.

Committee of Accounts appointed and sent out.

Mr. Robert Mafor, Major Thomas Smith, and Mr. John Pollard.

Committee of Laws appointed and sent out.

Mr. Philip Clarke, Major Thompson and Col. Codd.

Upon proposall from His Ex^{ty}. Resolved that the said Comitted draw up the Acts of Religion anew and abreviate the same.

Voted and Resolved Unanimously that this House do address and Congratulate His Ma^{ty} happy deliverance from the late treacherous designed assassination.

The House adjourns for two hours.

Post Meridien - The House Met again

By the House of Burgesses July the 2^d. 1690.

This House humbly Represent to y^e Ex^{ty} that there are at this tyme one white servant woman and two Indians in the Custody of y^e Sheriffe of Ann Arundell County for Murther or Suspicion thereof.

Therefore we humbly supplicate your Ex^{ty} that you would be so favourably pleased to take such Measures therein as your Ex^{ty} shall in your Wisdom think fitt from such Charges as may arise from long detaining them.
