Mr. Tyler from the Committee of Aggrievances enters the House and delivers
Mr. Speaker the following Report Viz By the Committee of Aggrievances Nov 9. 1713
It's humbly offered to this Committee as an Aggrievance that the Bounds of several
Parishes in several Counties within this Province are so uncertain that it
hath caused several Disputes between the Parishioners and Incumbent of
the said Parishes they being not bounded by natural Bounds or otherwise
which might be prevented if the Justices of each County or the major Part of
them had Power given them to determine such Disputes as aforesaid by
ascertaining the Bounds of such Parishes for the future and cause their Orders
therein to be entered on their County Records. All which is referred to the
Consideration of the House And it's further offered to this Committee as
an Aggrievance that whereas there has been several Disputes arose between
the Vestry and Incumbent that is ^{they} inserted into any Parish some considerable
Time after the laying the County Levy or such Incumbent that shall remove
himself before his Year is completed what Part of the forty of Pole belongs
to him that is inserted as aforesaid or him that removes as aforesaid for that year
there being no Law to ascertain the same. All which is referred to the
Consideration of the House
