Lower house of Assembly and sent to the Upper house by Mr. Lee and Mr. Cable
who returned and say they have delivered it — Resolved that the
Printer be allowed five hundred pounds of Tobacco for the printing the Laws
for the County as last sessions and that Mr. Parker make copies of all the
Publick Laws and the heads of all the Private Laws for which he is to be allowed
(by agreement made with him) five pounds

And the said Copies to be delivered to the Printer the latter end of the
next week — Order that Mr. Lee & Mr. Gough go to the Upper house
to acquaint them that nothing of publick business remains before
this House unfinished — They return and say they have delivered
Messages — Philomena Lloyd Esq. from the Upper house Delivers Message
a Letter of Daniel Dulany Esq. on Behalf of Matthew Wallaw & several
Inhabitants of new Munster thus Endorsed — May it please your Hon.

Being convened (as Council) for Matthew Wallaw and others in a Bill lying
Before this Honourable House concerning new Munster I think my self in duty
Obliged humbly to move your Hon. for a Rule to have a Copy of such Evidence
as have been or shall be taken to support the allegations of Richard Thatcher.
Petitioner being willing to be under the like rule on any Counters side humbly concur
this motion will save your Honours much Time and that it is agreeable to a
Parliamentary proceeding I am with the greatest Submissiveness

This board is of Opinion that the within Motion is just and reasonable and desires
the Lower house would direct their Clerk to Deliver Wallaw or his Council
Application Copies of all the Evidence of any kind that lies before their house
to name Commissioners to Examine such Evidence Witnesses as shall be mentioned
to them on either side That are or shall become unable to Travel, But that such
as are to be Summoned down to attend next Sessions

To the Honble the Upper house of Assembly with w^{ch} this house Consents & Appoint
Col^l Horman and Col^l Wyson or any One to Examine such Evidence as are not
able to come to Annapolis — Col^l Young from the Upper house acquaint
Mr. Speaker that his Hon^l the Governor commands him and the whole
house to attend him immediately in the Council Chamber and with Draw

Thereupon Mr. Speaker with the whole house got to the Council Chamber
where his Hon^l the Governor was pleased to Enact the severall Inquest Bills
following into Laws (they being assented to by the Upper house) by Sealing them
with with the St. Honble the Lord Proprietary's Seal at Arms and Endorsing them thus
