October Inst. Wednesday morning October the 10th 1722. According to His Lordships writt of prorogation the severall members met as on yesterday, notice being sent to the Upper House to acquaint His Hon^{or} the Gov^r that a sufficient number of members are met to make an House - Coll^o Wm. Stollard and Coll^o Saml. Young from the Upper House wth Mr. Saml. Skiffen Cl^k of the said House, enter the House by virtue of a Sedition to them directed and ad^o to the se^o Members aforesaid the se^o Oaths as the appointed by Act of Assembly, who severally subscribed the said Oaths and also the Test and then withdrew.

Coll^o Telghman from the Upper House acquaints the severall members of that His Hon^{or} the Govern^r commands them immediately to attend him in the Upper House.

Therefore they go to the Upper House where His Hon^{or} the Gov^r was pleased to command them to return to their own House and to make choice of a speaker, they return and by Majority of votes Elect the Hon^{ble} Rob^t. Myles Esq^r for their speaker and place him in the Chair.

Coll^o Mackall and Mr. Tyler are sent to the Upper House to acquaint His Hon^{or} the Governour of the choice of a speaker - they return and say they delivered their message. James Bowles and John Rousby Esq^r from the Upper House inform the members of this House that His Honour the Governour requires them to present their speaker.

Whereupon the severall members repair to the Upper House and there present their speaker to His Honour the Governour.

His Hon^{or} the Governour approves the choice and commands him to take that place upon him Mr. Speaker in the name of the whole House desires His Hon^{or} the Governour on his Lordships behalfs to confirm all the ancient and accustomed privileges belonging to the said House, which His Hon^{or} was pleased to grant for w^{ch} Mr. Speaker returned the thanks of the whole House.

After w^{ch} His Hon^{or} the Governour was pleased to deliver himself to the members of the Upper and Lower Houses in the following words viz^t

Gen^t of the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly the happy agreement between me and the late Gen^t Assembly in the severall affairs gives me great hopes of the like good harmony wth the present
