Gentlemen of the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly, I Answer to the joint Address presented Me by both Houses, on Wednesday left, I promise you I my best Endeavours to engage such a Friendly Correspondence with our Neighborrs of Unimin, as you deire; which, indeed, feems the most probable Means of promoting the Value of Tobacco, a common Concern to both Colonies.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates, I fincerely thank you for the Marks of your Good-Will towards Me. I shall give Orders for the Alteration to be made in the Provincial Commission, agreeable to your late Address.

Gentlemen of both Hufes, Before I dismiss you, I desire you would favourably accept my earnest Wishes for your General Welfare, which I hope you will daily advance in your feveral Counties, by a faithful Duty to the Government, in all i.s Parts; and by mutual Justice and Good-Humour amongst your selve.
