Samuel Chamberlain, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers Mr. Speaker the Bill, entitled, *An Act for the Relief of Samuel Deavor, Michael Taylor, William Burros, James Carter, Sarah Butcher and William Biggs, languishing Prisoners, Indorsed*, ' By the Upper House of Assembly, July 26. 1740. Read the Second Time and will Pass with the following Amendments, instead of the last Clause in the Bill, put the following one, *And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforesaid*, That before Michael Taylor, one of the Prisoners intended to be relieved by this Act, shall be relieved and discharged from his Imprisonment by virtue of this Act, he the said Michael Taylor shall enter into a Recognizance to the Lord Proprietor in the Sum of Two Hundred Pound Currency, and so find two good and sufficient Inhabitants of this Province,
