Thursday Morning, *May 11, 1749.*

THE House met according to Adjournment, and was called over. All the Members appeared as on Yesterday. The Proceedings were read. *Richard Lee* and *Benedict Calvert*, Esquires, from the Upper House, acquaint Mr. Speaker, that the Governor requires the Attendance of the Lower House in the Upper House.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and, attended by the Members of the Lower House, went to the Upper House; where his Excellency made the following Speech; viz.

*Gentlemen of the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly;*  
As I find myself under a Necessity, for many important Reasons, to prorogue this Assembly; I do therefore, with the Advice of his Lordship's Council of State, prorogue you to Wednesday the 24th Day of this Instant *May*; and you are to take Notice, you are prorogued to that Day accordingly.

So endeth this Meeting in Assembly, this 11th Day of *May*, in the Year of our Lord, 1749.
