vernor in the Upper House; where his Excellency made the following SPEECH, wiz.

GENTLEMEN of the Upper and Lower Houses of ASSEMBLY,

Y OU will lea n from fome Minutes which the Earl of Loudoun has given me to lay before you, that a Pilin has been formed for the better Defence of his Majestu's Dominion. that a Pin has been formed for the better Defence of his Majesty's Dominions in North-America, " and for Announg his Majerty's Enemies in these Parts: You will also see what Share his Lordship expects you wil take in carrying the Plan into Execution: And as the Supplies that I am to ask of you are " imall, in Companion to what some of his Majesty's Colonies generously offered to grant on this Occasion, " and your Treops to be employed for the more immediate Protection of this Province, I need not, I hope, " use any other Arguments to press you to comply with his Lordship's Requisitions. And as I doubt not " but we all meet incerely disposed to manifest our Zeal for, and to promote, the Service of our most " gracious Sovereign, I flatter myfelf we shall proceed with Unanimity, and give such Dispatch to the "Bufineis on which we are Affembled, as the present Posture of Assairs, and the advanced Season, require." His Excellency then delivered to Mr. Speaker, the Minutes Referred to in his Speech.
