On Motion, Leave given to bring in a Bill for the Relief of certain languishing Prisoners in the several County Jails therein mentioned. ORDERED, That Mr. Chase, Mr. Allen, Mr. Harrison, Mr. Beall, and Mr. Tyler, do pre-

pare and bring in the same. Mr. Ralph Dobinson is appointed a Committee Clerk.

ORDERED, That he be qualified.
