

him sign and seal the said laws. Mr. Speaker left the chair, and, with the members of this house, went to the senate, and there presented the following engrossed bills to the governor, who signed the same, and affixed the great seal thereto, in the presence of the members of both houses.

- No. 14. An additional supplement to the acts for assessment of property.
- No. 15. An act to revive the proceedings of Queen-Anne's county court.
- No. 16. An act relating to the qualification of jurors.
- No. 17. An act of indemnity.
- No. 18. An act to ascertain the allowance of justices, jurymen, witnesses, and constables.
- No. 19. An act to enable the judges of the general court to appoint their clerks, and to empower such clerks to provide repositories for the records.
- No. 20. An act for the better security of the government.
- No. 21. A supplementary act to an act, entitled, An act to regulate the militia.
- No. 22. A supplement to the act for the special appointment of inspectors.
- No. 23. An act to prevent counterfeiting loan-office certificates.

Mr. Speaker, with the rest of the members, returned and resumed the chair.

The house adjourns till the first Monday in March next.
