A sufficient number of delegates to proceed to business being convened at the ball room, they severally qualified in the presence of each other, by taking the several oaths required by the constitution and form of government, subscribing a declaration of their belief in the christian religion, and by taking, repeating, and subscribing the oath of fidelity prescribed by the act, entitled, an act to punish certain crimes and misdemeanors, and to prevent the growth of toryism.

The house then proceeded to the choice of a speaker, and the honourable William Fitzhugh,

Esq; was elected by ballot.

The house adjourns till to-morrow morning o o'clock.
