

The bill to extend the time limited for bringing in and settling claims against this state, &c. was read the second time and passed.

The report on the petition of Daniel M'Comisky was read the second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto.

The petition of James Beaumont was referred to Mr. Quynn, Mr. R. Bowie, and Mr. N. Worthington, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from Jacob and John Rowland, executors of Jacob Mastin, and Rachel Perrin, administratrix of Joseph Perrin, praying an act may pass to enable the aforesaid Rachel Perrin to convey certain lands to Charles Montgomery; was preferred and read, and referred to Mr. Oneale, Mr. Baker, and Mr. Stull, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Bracco, from the committee, brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker the following report:

THE committee, to whom were referred the representation of Richard Anderson, and other officers of the Maryland line, and citizens of this state, beg leave to report, That they have inquired into the sundry allegations therein contained, and find them to be strictly true, and are of opinion, that as they have been wounded and disabled, in fighting for the liberties of their country, that this state is in honour and gratitude bound to promote their future ease and happiness, and are of opinion that a sum of money not less than half their respective pay ought, during their natural lives, to be annually granted to them, as a donation from the state of Maryland, without being subject to the conditions, or in bar of any sum or emoluments which they may be entitled to receive from the United States. All which is submitted to the honourable house.

Mr. B. Worthington appeared in the house.

The memorial of sundry traders and merchants of this state, was read the second time, and referred to Mr. Lethbrury, Mr. Maxwell, Mr. Jackson, Mr. Waters, and Mr. Graves, to consider and report thereon.

The report on the petition of sundry inhabitants of Baltimore-town, respecting a health officer, was read the second time, concurred with, and leave given to bring in a bill pursuant thereto. ORDERED, That Mr. M'Mechen, Mr. Steret, and Mr. Joseph Dashiell, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to repeal that part of an act to impose duties on certain enumerated articles imported into and exported out of this state, and on all goods, wares and merchandizes, imported into this state, which relates to the duties on exports, and to alter and amend the said act. ORDERED, That Mr. Stone, Mr. B. Worthington, Mr. Lethbrury, Mr. Ramsey, Mr. Gantt, Mr. Steret, and Mr. Bracco, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The bill to settle and pay the civil list, and other expences of civil government; and the bill to extend the time limited for bringing in and settling claims against this state; were sent to the senate by Mr. Cramphin.

Mr. Stull brings in and delivers to Mr. Speaker a bill, entitled, A Supplement to an act empowering Martin Harry, administrator of John Waley, to sell and dispose of a certain house and lot in the town of Skipton in Washington county; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The petition of Jesse Suit was referred to Mr. Faw, Mr. Waters, and Mr. Purnell, to consider and report thereon.

A petition from sundry inhabitants of Somerset county, for extending a road and making a new wharf on the south side of Wiccomico river; was preferred and read.

The following question being propounded to the house, viz. That leave be given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to repeal an act, entitled, An act to provide a permanent fund for the further encouragement and establishment of Washington college, and also to repeal from the 19th to the 36th section of an act, entitled, An act for founding a college on the western shore of this state, and establishing the same, together with Washington college on the eastern shore, into one university, by the name of The University of Maryland? The previous question was called for and put, That the said question be now put? The yeas and nays being called for by Mr. Ridgely appeared as follow:
