

The bill for the valuation of personal property within this state, and the bill to impose certain rates and duties upon coaches and other carriages, were sent to the senate by Mr. Lethrbury.

Thomas Stone, Esq; from the senate, delivers to Mr. Speaker the bill for the more effectual preservation of the breed of wild deer, endorsed; "By the senate, February 3, 1786: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Amendments proposed. Page 1. In the 3d line after "extinct," insert "in several of the counties of this state." In the 3d line from the bottom strike out "three" and insert "six." In the 2d line from the bottom strike out the word "twenty" and insert the word "ten." Page 2. In the 2d line strike out "twenty" and insert "ten." In the 6th line strike out "three" and insert "six." In the fourth line from the bottom, after the word "flesh," insert "except dried venison hams." In the 2d line from the bottom, strike out "three" and insert "six." Page 3. In the 3d line after "same," insert "or that the same was not killed contrary to the prohibitions of this act." In the 9th line strike out "twenty" and insert "ten." Page 4. In the 4th line from the bottom, after "prevent," strike out "any person or persons whatever," and insert "the owner." In the 3d line from the bottom, after "killing," insert "tame deer or."

And the bill for the further relief of the securities of Thomas Williams, deceased, late collector of the tax and public dues in Prince-George's county, and for other purposes therein mentioned, endorsed; "By the senate, January 18, 1786: Read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Amendments proposed. After "county" in the 4th line and 3d page, insert "or a majority of them." After the word "certificates" in the 6th line same page, insert "heretofore." After "state" in the same line, insert "or to be issued for any debt now due from this state." At the end of the third page insert "And be it enacted, That if any of the property late of the said Thomas Williams is sold by law for the debt due to the state, it may be disposed of upon the same credit, and upon the same terms, as the property of the said securities is allowed by this act to be sold, and bonds taken for the same, with good and sufficient security, to be approved as aforesaid, shall be received by the treasurer, and credit given for the same upon the same terms and conditions, and to the same intent and purpose, that the bonds for the property of the said securities, or any of them, sold in virtue of this act, are above directed to be received and credited." In the 4th page and 4th line strike out "June" and insert "July." After the word "such" in the 8th line of the same page, insert "and notice shall be given by the said securities as soon as may be after the passage of this act, for three weeks successively in the Annapolis gazette, and at the court-house door of Prince George's county, of their power under this act, and the time of payment aforesaid." After the word "pay" in the 3d line from the bottom of the same page, insert "what is justly due on account of." In the 2d line from the bottom same page strike out "June" and insert "July." In the same line between "he" and "she" insert "or," and strike out "or they." In the same line after "shall" insert "thereafter." In the same line strike out "six" and insert "eight." Strike out the first clause in the 5th page. At the end of the bill insert "Provided that the interest upon the debt due from the said Thomas Williams, and his securities, be annually and punctually paid, from and after the first day of January seventeen hundred and eighty seven."

The house adjourns till 5 o'clock.
