21. No motion shall be made after the hour of adjournment without leave of the house.

22. Before any person is named to any office or appointment, to which any salary or allowance is to be annexed, the allowance or falary shall be first ascertained.

23. All mildemeanors which shall happen in the house, shall be censured or fined by the house.

24. If any member shall depart without leave of the house, or having leave of absence for a time shall not return agreeable thereto, he shall forfeit all his preceding allowance for his attendance during the fession, and the committee of claims shall not make any allowance for the preceding attendance of fuch member, unless by special order of the house, on such member making reasonable excuse for fuch departure or neglect to return as aforefaid.

25. No member shall answer on the year and nays who did not divide on the question, and if any member divides on one fide and on the yeas and nays answers on the other, it shall be so noted on

26. All fines imposed by the house shall be paid to the clerk, and applied as the house shall direct. 27. The substance of all petitions, memorials, or other applications to the house, shall be entered

28. The clerk of the house shall, on the first day of every session, put into the hands of the

speaker a correct list of every matter referred from the preceding session.

29. On motion or debate, any member may call for the reading any law, journal, record, or

other public proceeding, which may relate to the subject matter.

30. No member shall take out of the house any bill or other paper belonging to the house without leave of the speaker, under the penalty of such fine as shall be imposed by the speaker, not exceeding

31. No member shall nominate more than one person on any committee. The house appointed Mr. William Pinkney, Mr. Archibald Golder, and Mr. John Gassaway,
