By the COMMITTEE of CLAIMS.

YOUR committee beg leave to report, that they have examined the accounts and proceedings of Thomas Harwood, Esquire, treasurer of the western shore, and find, by an account settled by the committee of claims the 1st of November, 1785, there was a balance of £. 32890 3 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ specie, and £. 8271 1 3 old continental money, remaining in the treasury.

That it appears to your committee, by the accounts of the said treasurer, he hath received since the 1st of November, 1785, the date of the last report, to the 1st of November, 1786, from the treasurer of the eastern shore, £. 186 14 1 in bills of credit emitted by an act of assembly passed the 8th of June, 1780, interest due on said bills £. 50 10 3, in bills of credit made by an act of congress 18th of March, 1780, £. 191 5, for interest due on said bills £. 53 13 8, and in specie the sum of £. 12513 9 2, for escheats, caution and improvements on land certificates, the sum of £. 3348 11 3 specie; from the intendant of the revenue £. 39 15 0 in journal certificates, £. 7156 2 6 in certificates issued agreeably to the act to adjust the debts due from this state, interest discounted on said certificates to the amount of £. 187 10 1, in certificates issued agreeably to the act proposing to the citizens of this state creditors of congress on loan-office certificates, £. 3968 2 9, interest discounted on said certificates £. 224 18 11, in depreciation certificates the sum of £. 6273 13 4, interest discounted on said certificates £. 775 19 8, in bills of credit emitted by an act of assembly on the 8th June, 1780, £. 637 8 9, in bills of credit made by an act of congress 18th March, 1780, £. 314 12 6, and the sum of £. 100 in specie; from James Hindman, Esquire, £. 133 2 9 in depreciation certificates, interest discounted on said certificates £. 41 13 9; from doctor Philip Thomas, on account, £. 14 13 4 in certificates for debts adjusted,
