That it appears to your committee, the said treasurer hath received from the naval officers the sum of £.33093 9 8 specie, for marriage licences £.342 6 0 specie, and £.235 3 6 in bills of credit emitted by an act of assembly 8th June, 1787, interest discounted on said bills £.75 2 11, for ordinary and retailers licences £.633 6 10 specie, for since £.13 8 5 specie, for principal and interest of bonds in the old loan-office £.7 9 2 in certificates for debts adjusted, £.441 1 11 in certificates for continental certificates liquidated, interest discounted on said certificates £.21 15 7, in depreciation certificates £.1078 18 7, interest discounted on said certificates £.297 4 8, and

That it appears to your committee, certificates agreeably to the act to adjust the debts due from this state have been issued to sundry persons to the amount of £. 6936 1 1, certificates for the payment of the journal of accounts, paid fundry claimants their allowance, amounting to £.84 4 4, certificates issued to lieutenant-colonel Uriah Forrest, agreeably to a resolve passed at November resfion, 1784, for £.945 0 0, certificates agreeably to an act for the liquidation and payment of debts against persons convicted of treason, and the supplementary acts thereto, and paid sundry chamberts, amounting to £.2183 7 0, and certificates for loans, agreeably to an act to vest certain powers in the governor and the council, paked November session, 1785, to the amount of £.2468 2 0. That your committee have counted and burnt the sum of £.6918 17 8 of the bills of credit emitted by an act of assembly 8th June, 1780, and the sum of £.5720 17 0 of the bills of credit made by an act of congress 18th March, 1780. That your committee have also examined and cancelled certificates for debts adjusted to the amount of £. 18558 13 7, certificates for continental loan-office certificates liquidated, amounting to £.5541 19 24, depreciation certificates amounting to £. 54428 6 7, certificates issued for debts against persons convicted of treason, and British subjects, amounting to £. 1350 3 11, certificates issued agreeably to a resolve passed November session, 1784, amounting to £.636 15 0, and the further sum of £.5267 18 11; in certificates for provision seized, and other certificates issued under the several acts of assembly of this state.

That it appears to your committee, by the accounts of the faid treasurer, he hath paid away, from the 1st of November, 1785, to the 1st of November, 1786, the sum of £.93466 9 $0\frac{1}{2}$ specie. For all which payments have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts; and that there remains in the treasury a balance of £.7589 19 $0\frac{1}{2}$ specie, and £.8271 1 3 old continen-

tal money, appropriated in the following manner, viz.

That it also appears to your committee, there is the sum of £.8850 0 0 in the treasury of the emissions made by congress 18th March, 1780, it being part of the one tenth of the bills that became issuable in exchange for old continental money, and appropriated for the purpose of calling out of circulation the bills of credit emitted by the acts of assembly and resolves of convention of this state, and the surther sum of £.3614 8 4 in said bills, paid in on account of British creditors; which sums remain unapplied.

That your committee have examined the accounts of tobacco with faid treasurer, and find, by an account settled by the committee of claims 1st November, 1785, there was one hogshead of tobacco, net weight 985 pounds, remaining in the treasury, which has since been paid away, as per voucher

produced to your committee.
