A sufficient number of delegates being convened, they severally qualified in the presence of each other, by taking the several oaths required by the constitution and form of government, subscribing a declaration of their belief in the christian religion, and by taking, repeating and hipscribing, the oath of fidelity prescribed by the act, entitled, An act to punish certain crimes and missemeanors and to prevent the growth of toryism, and the oath to support the constitution of the United States.

The house proceeded to ballot for a speaker, and the ballots being deposited to the ballot bor appeared, upon examining the 'allots, that the honourable George Bern, Esquire, was unarimously

The house appointed Mr. William Harwood clerk. ORDERT That he qualify as such by taking the several oaths required, subscribing a declaration of his belief in the christian religion, and
